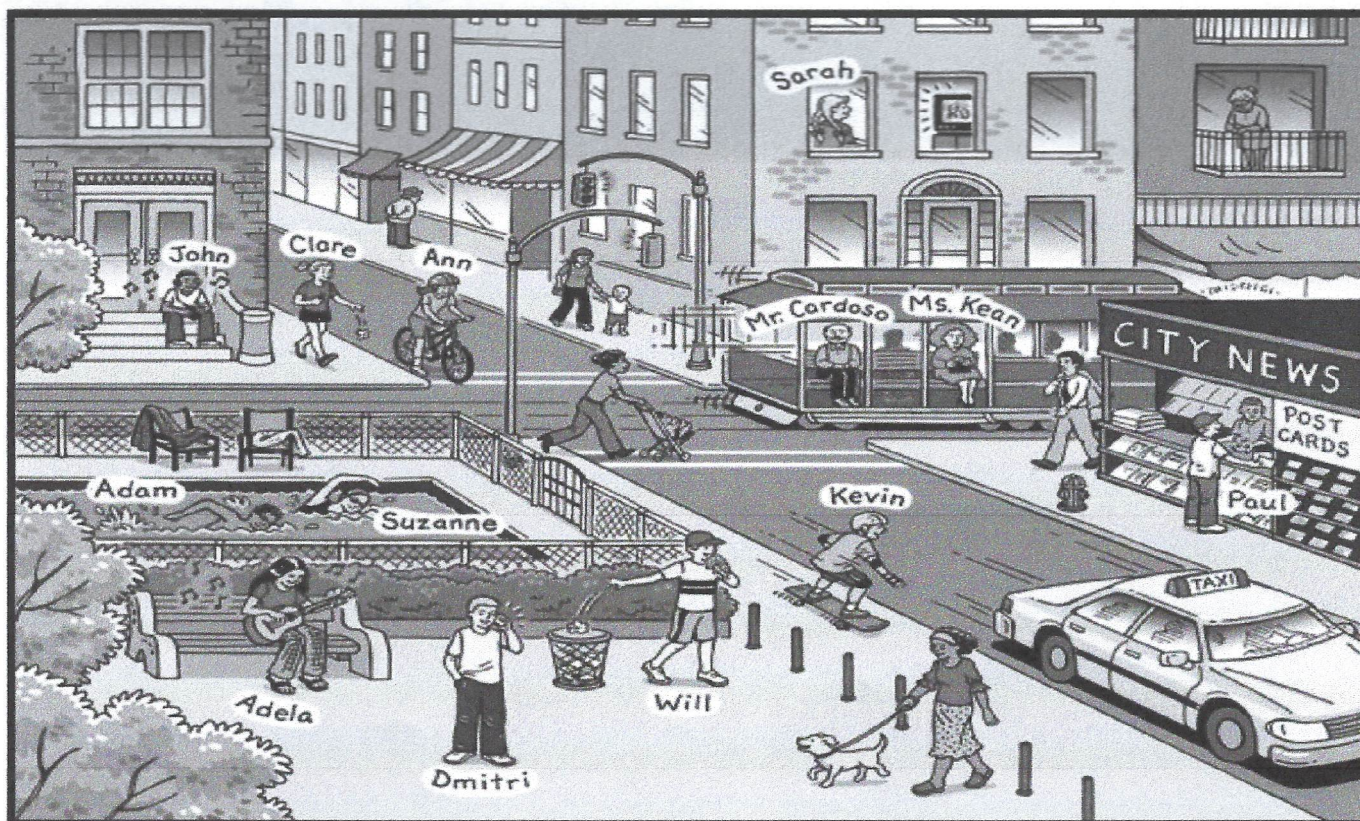


Where are they?
